If you're looking for eBooks and know the title and author, use OneSearch. OneSearch will let you search a title, author, or ISBN to locate specific items.

If you're looking for eBooks and are just getting started with your research, you can search OneSearch using keywords and limiters to explore.

If you're looking for articles and know the title and author, use OneSearch. OneSearch will let you search a title, author, or ISBN to locate specific items.

If you're looking for articles and are just getting started with your research, you can search OneSearch using keywords and limiters to explore. If you're looking for articles, just getting started with your research, and are doing research for a course in your major, consult a subject database. A subject database will provide advanced search options like articles with specific methodologies all the way to specialized reports by professionals in the field. To access subject databases, go to library.csus.edu and select the Databases icon. From there, you can filter databases by subject area or database type.

If you are looking for videos, consult a database. To access databases, go to library.csus.edu and select the Databases icon. From there, you can filter databases by database type to databases that have videos.
